Translations - Translation Philosophies

There are several translating philosophies that are used in the English language Bibles we have today. You should know which philosophy the translation you are reading uses. This tells you how to read your Bible. I have been reading different translations for the past several years. I still use the NASB (1995) when I preach. You also should know when your translation was made, and whether there are updates or revisions. Yes, just like software updates, Bible translations are updated. The KJV had four updates or revisions (1620, 1629, 1760, 1769). If you are reading the KJV now, it was last revised in 1769. These revisions were not done by the original translating committees.

One philosophy is "literal" or "word-for-word" or "formal equivalence." The translators try to stay as literal as possible and keep the sentence structures the same. They also try to keep the "idioms" the same. Most translators realize they cannot always stay "literal," but they try to keep it as close as possible. The NASB, the ASV, the RSV, the ESV, and the KJV are examples of this philosophy. Another philosophy is "thought-for-thought" or "functional equivalence." This

Another philosophy is "thought-for-thought" or "functional equivalence." This tries to get the thought rather than the exact words. The focus in this philosophy is ease of reading. Examples of this philosophy are the NIV and the NLT. There is also considerable variation in this category.

At the far end of the "thought-for-thought" philosophy is what some scholars call the "Free" translations. The MSG (The Message) is done by Eugene Peterson. He has a knowledge of Hebrew and Greek, but his translation appears focused on using English idioms to get across the various thoughts.

This is by no means the fullness of philosophies that translators use. Some may have a certain ideology in mind when translating (e.g. gender issues) that further complicates the debate. I don't have a firm conclusion as to which translation is the best. The reason for this is I can still consult the original text in Hebrew or Greek. So read to your heart's content, but research your translation's philosophy.
